Isaiah 64 is a prayer


- actually the second half of a prayer

What is prayer?


Prayer is simply talking to God.

- Telling Him what is on our heart.
- Even lamenting
- Asking Him to do something about it

ACTS – A Model for Prayer




- A Adoration (Praise, worship)
- C Confession (Acknowledge sins)
- T Thanks (Gratitude)
- S Supplication (Humbly asking)

We get to listen in to Isaiah and learn to improve our prayers




Isaiah's Prayer



- A 63:7-9 Remember He redeemed His people
- C 63:10 But the people rebelled
- A 63:11-14 God had led His people in glory (Moses)
- S 63:15-19 Return, LORD, for the sake of your servants
- S 64:1-5a O that You would come down
- C 64:5b-7 A BIG problem our ongoing sin
- S 64:8-12 Remember we are Your people





Have you ever felt that?


God – why aren't you acting? NOW!!!

And they came to *Him* and woke Him, saying, "Save *us*, Lord; we are perishing!" (Matthew 8:25)





Isaiah 64:1-3 God's Intervention




They thought God would kindle the brushwood, make the mountains quake and make the nations tremble. Why?



That is how God intervened in Exodus. Overwheming power. Lord, You did awesome things that we did not expect.



Isaiah 64:4-5a Come Down Lord!




⁴ For from days of old they have not heard or perceived by ear, Nor has the eye seen a God besides You, Who acts in behalf of the one who waits for Him.

True – God had acted to make the mountains quake Isaiah needed expand his scope –

Was that the only way God could act in behalf of His people?

This was God's goal for the Isaelites.


It is His goal for us Christians.




⁵ You meet him who rejoices in doing righteousness, Who remembers You in Your ways.



(God hides His face)


Unclean – like a leper


Filthy garment – menstrual garments


That is THE hard question – we have to be honest here

Why would God save people like us?






⁷ There is no one who calls on Your name, Who arouses himself to take hold of You;

Moses – following the episode with the golden calf

"Now therefore, I pray You, if I have found favor in Your sight, let me know Your ways that I may know You, so that I may find favor in Your sight. Consider too, that this nation is Your people." (Exodus 33:13)






⁷ There is no one who calls on Your name, Who arouses himself to take hold of You;

The Israelites failed at this.

How would we do better? What does it mean to arouse ourselves to take hold of God?

This is another opportunity to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, to encourage one another (cf. Heb 10-24-25)






For You have hidden Your face from us And have delivered us into the power of our iniquities.

⁸ But now, O LORD, You are our Father, We are the clay, and You our potter; And all of us are the work of Your hand.


Isaiah clings to our relationship, our identity with the Father



Isaiah comes in humble supplication saying that we are clay in the Father's hands.



Isaiah 64:8-12 We are Your People




⁹ Do not be angry beyond measure, O LORD, Nor remember iniquity forever; Behold, look now, all of us are Your people.

Isaiah continues to cling to our relationship, our identity as "Your people".

Beyond measure suggests that the divine rage could exceed permissible limits, but the Hebrew is ... 'do not let us feel the full weight of your anger'. (Motyer)



Isaiah 64:8-12 Dire Straits




¹⁰ Your holy cities have become a wilderness, Zion has become a wilderness, Jerusalem a desolation.

Isaiah 64:12 Time to Act!






Discussion Questions



- 1. 64.1 "Oh, that You would rend the heavens and come down ..." [Look at your adversaries! Do something about it!]
 Have you ever felt it was time for God to intervene? What was the situation? How desperate were you? How did you pray?
- 2. 64.4-5a We know you are a God "who acts on behalf of the one who waits for Him. You meet him who rejoices in doing righteousness, who remembers You in Your ways." Did Israel measure up to God's expectations here? As Christians today, how are we doing on that standard? What can we do to improve?
- 3. 64.5b-7 What were the sins of Israel? How bad were they?




Discussion Questions p2



- 4. 64.5b After all our sin, is it even possible to be saved? This is a hard question. On what basis can we ask God to act on our behalf? [Isaiah found it in 64.8-12]
- 5. 64.7 "There is none who arouses himself to take hold of YHWH."
 They were hopeless, and they weren't even trying to change. How about us today? How do we arouse ourselves? What does it look like to take hold of YHWH? What are biblical examples of doing that?
- 6. 64.7 "You have delivered us into the power of our iniquities." What does that look like? Is that occurring today? In the church? How do we avoid that?
