#### **Isaiah Review**



Chs. 1—39 show that he is the Sovereign of the nations, but chs. 40—66 show that he is the Savior of the world. He begins to show this in chs. 40—48, by predicting the deliverance from Babylon. But chs. 49—55 show that the real need of Israel is for deliverance from sin. Now in chs. 56—66 he is showing that Israel's witness to God's saviorhood is to, and for, the world."




Isaiah 1:4 (ESV)

<sup>4</sup>Ah, sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, offspring of evildoers, children who deal corruptly! They have forsaken the Lord, they have despised the Holy One of Israel, they are utterly estranged.




# Sin – False Worship




Isaiah 1:13–17 (ESV)

<sup>13</sup>Bring no more vain offerings; incense is an abomination to me. New moon and Sabbath and the calling of convocations— I cannot endure iniquity and solemn assembly. 14Your new moons and your appointed feasts my soul hates; they have become a burden to me; I am weary of bearing them. <sup>15</sup>When you spread out your hands, I will hide my eyes from you; even though you make many prayers, I will not listen; your hands are full of blood. <sup>16</sup>Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your deeds from before my eyes; cease to do evil, <sup>17</sup>learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause.



#### Sin – False Worship



Isaiah 58:3-5 (ESV)

<sup>3</sup>'Why have we fasted, and you see it not? Why have we humbled ourselves, and you take no knowledge of it?' Behold, in the day of your fast you seek your own pleasure, and oppress all your workers. <sup>4</sup>Behold, you fast only to quarrel and to fight and to hit with a wicked fist. Fasting like yours this day will not make your voice to be heard on high.

<sup>5</sup>Is such the fast that I choose, a day for a person to humble himself? Is it to bow down his head like a reed, and to spread sackcloth and ashes under him? Will you call this a fast, and a day acceptable to the Lord?




# Sin – Idolatry




Isaiah 2:8 (ESV)

<sup>8</sup>Their [house of Jacob] land is filled with idols; they bow down to the work of their hands, to what their own fingers have made.

Many other references to idol worship – Isaiah points out the complete **foolishness** of the people's actions.



# Sin – Idolatry




Isaiah 44:12–17 (ESV)

<sup>12</sup>The ironsmith takes a cutting tool and works it over the coals. He fashions it with hammers and works it with his strong arm. He becomes hungry, and his strength fails; he drinks no water and is faint. <sup>13</sup>The carpenter stretches a line; he marks it out with a pencil. He shapes it with planes and marks it with a compass. He shapes it into the figure of a man, with the beauty of a man, to dwell in a house. <sup>14</sup>He cuts down cedars, or he chooses a cypress tree or an oak and lets it grow strong among the trees of the forest. He plants a cedar and the rain nourishes it.



#### Sin – Idolatry



Isaiah 44:12–17 (ESV) (continued)


<sup>15</sup>Then it becomes fuel for a man. He takes a part of it and warms himself; he kindles a fire and bakes bread. Also he makes a god and worships it; he makes it an idol and falls down before it.

<sup>16</sup>Half of it he burns in the fire. Over the half he eats meat; he roasts it and is satisfied. Also he warms himself and says, "Aha, I am warm, I have seen the fire!"

<sup>17</sup>And the rest of it he makes into a god, his idol, and falls down to it and worships it. He prays to it and says, "Deliver me, for you are my god!"



#### Sin – Oppression of the Vulnerable



Isaiah 1:23 (ESV)

<sup>23</sup>Your princes are rebels and companions of thieves. Everyone loves a bribe and runs after gifts. They do not bring justice to the fatherless, and the widow's cause does not come to them.


Isaiah 3:14–15 (ESV)

<sup>14</sup>The Lord will enter into judgment with the elders and princes of his people: "It is you who have devoured the vineyard, the spoil of the poor is in your houses.

<sup>15</sup>What do you mean by crushing my people, by grinding the face of the poor?" declares the Lord God of hosts.



#### Sin – Failure to Seek the Lord



As Assyria threatens Jerusalem, they seek an alliance with Egypt:

Isaiah 30:1–3 (ESV)


1"Ah, stubborn children," declares the Lord, "who carry out a plan, but not mine, and who make an alliance, but not of my Spirit, that they may add sin to sin;

<sup>2</sup>who set out to go down to Egypt, without asking for my direction, to take refuge in the protection of Pharaoh and to seek shelter in the shadow of Egypt!

<sup>3</sup>Therefore shall the protection of Pharaoh turn to your shame, and the shelter in the shadow of Egypt to your humiliation.




Many other sins are called out with "Woes to the Wicked" in Chapter 5 – drunkenness, calling evil good and good evil, arrogance, injustice and corruption from leadership – that section in ends with:

Therefore, as the tongue of fire devours the stubble, and as dry grass sinks down in the flame, so their root will be as rottenness, and their blossom go up like dust; for they have rejected the law of the Lord of hosts, and have despised the word of the Holy One of Israel.





Isaiah 5:26-29 (ESV)


<sup>26</sup>He will raise a signal for nations far away, and whistle for them from the ends of the earth; and behold, quickly, speedily they come! <sup>27</sup>None is weary, none stumbles, none slumbers or sleeps, not a waistband is loose, not a sandal strap broken;

<sup>28</sup>their arrows are sharp, all their bows bent, their horses' hoofs seem like flint, and their wheels like the whirlwind.

<sup>29</sup>Their roaring is like a lion, like young lions they roar; they growl and seize their prey; they carry it off, and none can rescue.

Do you not hear? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? <sup>22</sup>It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and spreads them like a tent to dwell in; <sup>23</sup>who brings princes to nothing, and makes the rulers of the earth as emptiness.



<sup>26</sup>Lift up your eyes on high and see: who created these? He who brings out their host by number, calling them all by name; by the greatness of his might and because he is strong in power, not one is missing.






Isaiah 11:1-5 (ESV)







12c ...yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.






Isaiah 65:17–19 (ESV)

<sup>19</sup>I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress.






# Time of Peace - Isaiah 2:4 (ESV)






# Changes in the Animal Kingdom - Isaiah 11:6–9






# Long Life, No More Infant Mortality, Unhindered Relationship with God - Isaiah 65:20–25

<sup>20</sup>No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the young man shall die a hundred years old, and the sinner a hundred years old shall be accursed. <sup>21</sup>They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. <sup>22</sup>They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands.


<sup>23</sup>They shall not labor in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be the offspring of the blessed of the Lord, and their descendants with them.




# Our response to all of this?




# God's Holiness vs Our Sin

... a "sin", to speak more particularly, consists in doing, saying, thinking, or imagining, anything that is not in perfect conformity with the mind and law of God. "Sin", in short, as the Scripture saith, is "the transgression of the law". The slightest outward or inward departure from absolute mathematical parallelism with God's revealed will and character constitutes a sin, and at once makes us guilty in God's sight."




